Enforcement Order Morse Brothers, Inc., Off Hill Road, Map 23, Lot 31

The Board of Health Agent observed silt in White Oak Brook. The work being done at Morse Brothers bog has impacted the stream. There is water being pumped into the brook, it is pumping dirt into stream. The Contractor shut the pump off and the stream began to clear, but silt is on bottom

MA DEP performed a site visit with Agent Schellenger and advised issuing an enforcement order. The enforcement conditions include:

- Preparing a restoration plan, including the following requirements by February 28, 2023.
- Measuring the depth of the newly deposited bog sediment in White Oak Brook downstream of the bog outlet as far as the sediment depth is greater than 4".
- Removing the sediment to original substrate in all areas/locations where the sediment depth is greater than 4" by April 30, 2023.
- Monitoring dewatering to ensure no additional silt is introduced into White Oak Brook.
- Hanson Conservation being permitted to monitor the above efforts at all reasonable times.
