I <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

Ms. FitzGerald-Kemmett called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

II <u>PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENTS AND UPCOMING MEETINGS</u>

Ms. Rein read the public announcements and upcoming meetings.

III <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

1. Request – Boy Scout Troop 68 to use Town Hall Green on October 15/16 for a pumpkin sale and November 26/27 for a wreath sale.

MOTION by Mr. Weeks, seconded by Mr. Heal, to allow Boy Scout Troop 68 to use Town Hall Green on October 15/16 for a pumpkin sale and November 26/27 for a wreath sale. *Voted* 5 - 0

- 2. Building Inspector Enforcement Orders
 - a. 61 Ransom Road
 - b. 45 Acorn Road
 - c. 16 Liberty Street

Mr. Glass gave brief overviews of each property.

<u>61 Ransom Road</u> has a shed on the front of the property being used as a school by the owners' daughter. It was temporarily approved during Covid, with the caveat it would be moved to the back of the property. The daughter will not relocate the building. Mr. Glass has physically gone to the property to speak with the owners and forwarded follow-up correspondence. Each time the owners has refused to comply.

MOTION by Ms. FitzGerald-Kemmett, seconded by Mr. Weeks, to allow Mr. Glass to work with Town's legal counsel to remove the shed. *Voted 5 - 0*

45 Acorn Road is actually confirmed by Mr. Glass, through license plate verification, to be 14 Acorn Road. Owner was initially served in 2003 for all debris, from cleanup jobs he does, on the front lawn. Mr. Glass has physically gone to the property to speak with the owners and forwarded follow-up correspondence. The owner has stated he will clean the area but no attempts to date. Mr. Weeks read the bylaw that states the owner can be fined up to \$20 per day. Mr. Glass also noted that as this has been a long standing issue, the property owner has passed and the son is now the owner of the property

MOTION by Mr. Weeks, seconded by Mr. Heal, to allow Mr. Glass to work with Town's legal counsel to determine the fine to be imposed upon the property, with a suggested deadline of seven days from the next correspondence. **Voted 5 - 0**

<u>16 Liberty Street</u> initially requested permission, and was permitted, to park cars on the property. Currently there are seven cars as well as other large commercial vehicles on the property. Mr. Glass has previously reached out to the owner and was assured all vehicles would be removed. To date they are still there. Neighbors have complained as well. The property is also located close to a resource area. With waste materials on the property, the same bylaw for 14 Acorn should be applied here.

3. Update from Impress, LLC regarding growth facility and potential delivery

Ezra Parzybok and Shanel Lindsay, consultants with Impress shared their background and presented what Impress would provide for the Town. They focused primarily on their development of regulations for growing, the company's delivery option, and then briefly discussed projected financials for the Town. Their hiring schedule would give Town of Hanson citizens preference.

The Board thanked them for the detailed presentation. They have questions, similar to what the Town attendees will have in October, and expect Impress to be in attendance.

Mr. Hickey had questions related to retail sales vs estimated income. He understands there will be several startup/year one expenses, he would like a review of the numbers and confirmation of validity.

Mr. Weeks had questions related to operation regulation requirements as the Town will be concerned where sales are going. He also requested they forward marketing materials to Town Hall to be added to the Town's website. Impress stated they will forward the updated presentation and numbers to Kevin.

4. Request – Town Administrator Lisa Green to borrow against her vacation days in accordance with Employment agreement.

Ms. Green is on medical leave, projected for a mid-October return. As the Board ended unlimited sick time, the current option for her is to borrow against future vacation time. This stipulation is included in her contract, with board approval. If she does not return, she would need to reimburse the Town.

Mr. Hickey suggests approving for two weeks, then review at next meeting. If at that time, Ms. Green does not have a confirmed return date, the Board will further discuss.

MOTION by Mr. Weeks, seconded by Mr. Heal, to allow Ms. Green to borrow ten days against vacation and revisit the discussion during the September 27 meeting, *Voted* 5 - 0
