Allan stated Thomas Mill needs rebuilt wheel and Marcus stated it needs work on the building. 1st built in 1685, then early 1800 then burned in 1929 and redone in 1970

COG has heard there are storage problems for many town items – needs a proper presentation.

Allan asked if boulders/ historical markers could be funded through CPC and Roberta thought yes.

Allan passed out the ideas he spoke to Roberta about for HHC at last Wednesday's meeting.

Allan stated and Roberta confirmed you could improve parking at Thomas Mill and make Packet Parks at Maquan Pond on Rt. 14 and at Thomas Hall.

Phil Clemons stepped in at 6:45pm

Roberta stated that the last Capital Improvement Plan for Camp Kiwanee was 2005. What was done?

There is potential for preserving historic buildings. Allan & Marcus stated

the train depot-now storage for Dunkin Donuts, Cranberry buildings, the old store in South Hanson and homes - 2nd oldest house in town and Cushing home

Roberta asked what was going on with the school on East Washington St.

Allan stated it was privately owned but for sale for past 10 years.

Roberta asked about artifacts found in area – Indian wise

Allan stated early 1560 this area was called Thousand Acres and the Indian wanted the Ponds. Artifacts found on Crescent Street and Maquan Pond had arrowheads and that the "Indian Crossway" was Main Street to Elm Street towards East Bridgewater through Cedar Swamp.

Marcus stated when Church was surveyed they found the "Meeting House Path".

Allan said the 2 oldest churches are Baptist and Congregational but was also a Unitarian Church on E. Washington & Whitman and the area of the laundramat on Main Street was converted to a home.

Roberta asked about other old buildings – ie: fire houses, school houses. Allan said we have 2 old firehouses – one vacant and Privately owned in North Hanson and the other in South Hanson is used for storage by fire department and 4 old schoolhouses were converted to homes.

A historic house would be the Poor Farm - it is the house next to Sullivan's Funeral Home and the family still lives in it.

Roberta asked for any other changes we know of. There was discussion about the highway department area is looking to move and it could become an addition to the baseball. PCH – There is a 2 story building – was extension building and front ½ possible office space and is owned by Town. Allan asked Roberta if she would check to see if historic markers are eligible for CPC. Allan told about several Revolutionary Veteran markers he helped set in the cemeteries.

Allan stated at the end that Draden's Store which Mr. Gallagher is researching for his next book was moved to Airport Rd and in tack.
