## A Word from our Town Administrator



*And Just Like That, One Fiscal Year Closes and Another Begins.... Hats off to the Treasurer Collector's Office and the Hanson Accounting Team for a job well done!*

Here is a behind the scenes look at the process for closing out a fiscal year and opening a new one, and the series of tasks that must be completed to ensure the integrity of the financial records and to prepare for the upcoming year.

- ✓ Budget Review and Finalization: Before the end of the current fiscal year, the Town's budget for the upcoming fiscal year is reviewed and finalized. This involves discussions among the Town of Hanson's departments and approval by the Select Board.
- ✓ Complete All Transactions: All financial transactions for the current fiscal year should be completed, including processing payments, receipts, transfers and adjustments.
- ✓ Financial Audit and Reconciliation: Hanson's books are reconciled, and an external audit is conducted. This helps to ensure that all transactions are accurately recorded and that there are no discrepancies or errors.
- ✓ Report Generation and Submission: A financial report for the current fiscal year is created. This report details all of Hanson's financial activities for the year. It is submitted to the Select Board, the Massachusetts Division of Local Services and the Department of Revenue.
- ✓ Close Books for the Current Fiscal Year: Once all transactions have been completed, the books are closed for the current fiscal year. No further transactions for this year are allowed to be recorded after this point.
- ✓ Open Books for the New Fiscal Year: The books are opened for the new fiscal year and financial transactions for the new year can begin to be recorded.
- ✓ Implement New Budget: The approved budget for the new fiscal year is implemented on July 1. This involves allocating funds to the various departments and projects as laid out in the budget.

# Bear Sightings in Hanson!

In response to recent bear sightings in the Hanson area, residents are urged to secure their trash and bird feeders. Bears are highly adaptable creatures. Once they find a reliable food source, they tend to return. Following these steps will help avoid bear encounters:

## Secure Your Trash

- ✓ Store trash indoors. If possible, keep your trash containers inside your garage or shed until the morning of trash pickup.
- ✓ Use bear-resistant trash cans. If you must store trash outside, consider investing in bear-resistant trash cans. These are specifically designed to be difficult for bears to open.
- ✓ Don't overfill trash cans. Ensure lids are securely fastened. Bears can easily knock over a trash can and pry the lid off if it isn't secure.


- ✓ Clean trash cans regularly: This will help to reduce odors that may attract bears.

## Manage Your Bird Feeders

- ✓ Remove bird feeders. Consider removing bird feeders entirely during active bear seasons, typically from late spring to late fall. Birds have plenty of natural food sources during these seasons.
- ✓ If you choose to keep your bird feeder: use the right seed. Use thistle or Nyjer seed, which are less attractive to bears.
- ✓ Clean up spilled seed. Be sure to clean up any spilled seed or shells under the feeder regularly.
- ✓ Hang feeders high. Hang your feeders at least 10 feet off the ground and 4 feet from any attachment point, if possible. This will make it more difficult for a bear to access them.

Remember, bears are wild animals and should never be approached. If you see a bear, maintain a safe distance, and do not attempt to scare it away. Instead, report the sighting to local wildlife officials.

By taking these precautions, you can protect your property, ensure the safety of the local bear population, and reduce the potential for bear-human conflict. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

## *Fiscal 2024 Tax Assistance Program Application being Accepted through April*

The Town of Hanson offers various Tax Assistance Programs to help reduce taxes for those eligible, including the elderly, veterans, widow and widowers, the blind and those wishing to defer their tax liability.

Taxpayers must apply yearly between July 1 and April 1st of the fiscal year in which the tax is assessed. The Town of Hanson's new fiscal year starts every July 1.

We urge the taxpayers of Hanson to call—and let others know to call—the Assessor's Office for more information about how to get real estate tax relief. We realize not everyone has access to social media or computer access. The Assessor's Office telephone number is **(781) 293-5259**.

Most exemptions are state reimbursed for a certain percentage, with funds coming from the Assessor's Overlay Account.

All the exemptions we have to offer are posted on the Town website under the Board of Assessors tab. We also hold a forum in the fall at the Senior Center on School Street in Hanson. You can also stop by the Assessor's Office at any time and the staff will help you with your questions.

The Board of Assessors and staff stay educated on the changing requirements and implement increases as needed with Town Meeting approval.

Did you know that Ocean Spray was founded in 1930 in Hanson, Massachusetts, by three cranberry growers who wanted to expand the market for cranberries? The cooperative was led by growers Marcus L. Urann, Elizabeth F. Lee and John C. Makepeace, who had created a cranberry sauce. The cooperative developed more cranberry-based products. Ocean Spray was originally known as Cranberry Cannery, Inc.

## Conservation Commission Update

Your Hanson Conservation Commission has been hard at work throughout the Spring and the summer maintaining and improving Conservation Properties throughout the Town. More than six weeks ago, 120 Atlantic White Cedar saplings were planted in eight different locations that include three separate areas in the Smitty's Bogs Conservation Area. This essentially completes our work on the U.S. Department of Agriculture grant toward restoration of the bogs to natural habitat. We have been monitoring the plants two-to-three times per week and applying deer repellent. So far, all the plants have survived their initial shock and appear to be thriving. Last summer, we removed many water control devices throughout the area and are pleased to report that the Indian Head Brook can be seen flowing along its old waterway and has been populated with fish and other wetlands species along most of its water course, nearly to the old reservoir.
